



Usa ob 2




USA OB Under vs. Man Defense

#4 cuts to the ball side corner while #3 sets a screen for #5.

#5 cuts to the rim. #2 cuts out on top for the safety entry.




Usa ob 1



**USA OB Under vs. Man Defense**

#5 cuts to the corner, #4 breaks to the wing.

#2 screens for #3 who cuts in the lane looking for the pass from #1.




**USA OB Under vs. Man Defense**

If #3 does not get the ball, #2 screens in on #5's defender. #5 cuts in behind #2 looking for the lob in the lane.



Spain OB Under vs. Man Defense

#5 screens in for #2. #2 cuts out to the wing to receive the entry pass from #4.




Spain OB Under vs. Man Defense

As soon as #2 cuts off the screen, #3 screens across for #5. #4 looks to pass the ball inside to #5.





Spain OB Under vs. Man Defense

#5 screens in for #3. #4 cuts out to the opposite wing area.

#1 enters the ball to #3 on the left wing.



Spain OB Under vs. Man Defense

#3 now executes a dribble hand-off with #1 cutting and curling around #3.


#1 can take the ball and get in the lane, looking to score or dump the ball off to #5.

#3 may not give the ball to #1 and attack the rim himself.

## Spain ob 2




## Spain OB Under vs. Man Defense

#5 steps back and looks for the lob pass from #1. As this is happening, #4 cuts under the rim and seal his defender.

#5 looks to catch the ball in the air and at the same time dump the ball down to #4.





Spain OB Under vs. Man Defense

#4 steps out to receive the entry pass from #1. #2 cuts over to the top left wing to receive the next pass from #4.

#5 cuts across the lane to the right low block. #3 cuts to the left wing.




Spain OB Under vs. Man Defense

#4 now slides down and screens the wing defender while #1 cuts in behind #4 for the open jump shot on the wing / corner.



## Russia ob 2



### Russia OB Under vs. Man Defense

Play starts with #4 breaking out to the ball side corner area. #1 passes to #4.


At the same time, #5 is now screening for #3. #3 cuts off the screen from #5 and looks to get the pass inside from #4.

After screening, #5 then flashes to the mid high post area.

#1 enters and cuts to the opposite corner.



#3 cuts to the opposite corner area off a back screen from #2.



After screening, #2 breaks to the top of the key area.

#4 breaks out to the right wing while #5 cuts to the low post.

#1 passes to #4 and sprints out to get the ball back from #4.



#1 quickly takes the hand-off and drives the ball in the lane.




## Lithuania ob 2



### Lithuania OB Under vs. Man Defense

#4 steps out and sets a screen for #3. #1 looks for #3 inside for the first scoring opportunity.


#4 will then break to the ball after screening for #3. If #3 is not open, #1 passes to #4.



### Lithuania OB Under vs. Man Defense

Once #4 has the ball, he dribbles at #1 stepping inbounds and executes a dribble handoff with #1.

#1 will look to catch and shoot if he is open.




### Lithuania OB Under vs. Man Defense

If #1 is not open, he will then look for #2 coming off the screen from #5 on top.




## Lithuania ob 1



### Lithuania OB Under vs. Man Defense

The play starts with #2 and #5 setting a double screen for #3. #3 breaks to the ball side looking to catch and shoot if he is open.

As #3 comes off the double screen, #5 dives to the basket looking for the pass from #1.




### Lithuania OB Under vs. Man Defense

Just after the initial screening action from #2 and #5, #4 moves in and sets a screen for #2.

#1 looks to hit #2 on the opposite wing area. #4 will not dive to the basket when #2 comes off of his screen.




## Greece ob 2



### Greece OB Under vs. Man Defense

#3 cuts off a screen from #4 while #2 cuts over the top of #3 and uses a screen from #5.

#1 looks to enter the ball to either wing.




### Greece OB Under vs. Man Defense

#5 then screens for #4. #4 rolls over the top of the screen and into the lane.

#5 steps out after screening. #1 can also pass the ball straight out to #5, who can look to shoot or dump the ball inside to #4.





#5 screens for #2. #1 enters the ball to #2 on the left wing area. #3 delays his cut for a bit and then breaks to the top.

#2 passes to #3.





#3 attacks the lane on the dribble, looking to score or dump the ball off to #5 rolling to the basket after screening.




### Croatia OB Under vs. Man Defense

#4 screens in for #2. #1 enters the ball to #2 on the right wing.



### Croatia OB Under vs. Man Defense

#4 then breaks up to the top and makes a back door cut to the rim. #2 looks to make the lob pass to #4.






### Croatia OB Under vs. Man Defense

#3 breaks to the ball side wing / corner area off of a double screen from #4 and #5.

As soon as #3 cuts off the double, #4 breaks out on top.


#3 catches the ball and passes to #4 on top.

#1 sprints out and takes the ball to #4.

#5 slides up ready to set a ball screen for #1.


#1 drives off the ball screen from #5.

#5 rolls in the lane looking for the pass from #1.





If #5 does not get the ball from #1, #1 may look to reverse the ball on top to #4 who will look to make the high / low entry pass to #5 sealing in the paint.





#4 breaks to the ball side corner to receive the entry pass from #1.



#1 enters the ball to #4 and then cuts out to the opposite wing area.





#2 down screens for #5. #5 breaks out to the ball side wing area to receive the entry pass from #1.

After screening, #2 cuts to the opposite corner area.

#4 breaks out on top while #3 cuts to the right wing area.



#5 passes to #4 on top who reverses the ball to #3 on the right wing.

#1 steps out and back screens for #5.


#3 looks to hit #5 in the middle of the lane.

#4 then down screens for #1.

#3 looks to hit #1 breaking up for the open jumper.





China will then look to load up the center, either from the wing or corner.




#### Australia OB Under vs. Man Defense

Box set to begin.

#4 slides up and sets a double screen for #2.

#2 curls around the double screen and receives the entry pass on the ball side corner area.




#### Australia OB Under vs. Man Defense

#4 and #5 continue their action and set a double screen for #3.

#1 entered the ball to #2 and cut to the opposite wing area.

#2 looks to hit #3 for the open jump shot off the double screen from #4 and #5.





#4 and #5 set one more double screen for #1.

#3 looks to hit #1 for the open jumper.





Play starts with #2 cutting around #5 and using a screen from #4 and curls into the middle of the lane.

#4 then breaks out to the left corner. #5 breaks out to the left wing.





#4 reverses the ball to #5 who then passes to #3 on top.

#2 did not get the ball so he continues his cut and breaks out to the right wing.

#1 steps in and sets a back screen for #4.

#3 looks to hit #4 cutting to the rim.





#5 "picks the picker" and down screens for #1.

#3 looks to hit #1 on the left wing for the open jump shot.





#3 then down screens for #2. #5 passes to #2 on top.







#2 breaks out on top for the safety entry.





### Argentina OB Under vs. Man Defense

#5 and #4 sets a double staggered screen for #2, who cuts across the middle of the lane looking for the open jump shot on the right corner / wing area.

#4 will screen and open up in the lane looking for the entry pass from #1. This will be open if #4's defender tries to help on the screening action.




### Argentina OB Under vs. Man Defense

We will assume #2 received the entry pass.

#4 steps out and sets a ball screen on the wing with #2. #2 looks to score and #4 rolls to the basket.


#1 breaks out to the opposite wing.



### Argentina OB Under vs. Man Defense

#1 also has the option to skip the ball out on top to #3.

When that happens, #1 will break out to the left wing using a screen on the block from #5.





If #1 does not have a shot, #5 steps out and executes a pick and roll on the left wing.

As this is happening, #3 and #4 set a double screen for #2.

#### Argentina OB Under vs. Man Defense


Quick-hitting OB play with #5 stepping out and screening for #3 in the opposite corner.

#3 cuts over the top of the screen looking for the entry pass from #1.

#5 screens, opens up and seals looking for the pass under the basket from #1. If the defenders try and switch on this screen, #5 will have a great opportunity to score if he does a good job of sealing.





### Argentina OB Under vs. Man Defense

#3 screens for #2 who breaks to the right wing and receives the entry pass from #1.


After screening, #3 breaks out on top.



### Argentina OB Under vs. Man Defense

Once #2 has the ball, #4 and #5 set a double staggered screen for the inbounder, #1.

#1 breaks up the middle of the lane looking for the open jump shot on top. #3 flattens out to the left wing area.





If #1 does not have a shot, #5 quickly steps out and sets a ball screen for #1.

#1 drives the ball hard off the screen looking to score, kick out to #3 on the left side of the floor, or pass back to #5 on top for the 3 point shot or the high / low entry pass to #4 inside.





#1's first option is to hit #5 in the lane.







### Spain Side-out vs. Man Defense

#4 and #5 step out. #1 passes to #4 or #5. If #4 gets the ball, he will pass to #5.




### Spain Side-out vs. Man Defense

#3 now sets a back screen for #1. #1 cuts hard over the screen and into the lane.

#3 now cuts quickly to the corner area. This will be an effective way to get open, as #3's defender may have to help momentarily in the lane on the initial back screen.






#4 and #5 step out on the perimeter.

#1 enters the ball to #5.

#1 cuts hard to the rim while #2 cuts off his back. At the same time, #5 is executing a dribble hand-off with #2 on the right wing.


#2 takes the hand-off from #5. #5 rolls to the basket.

#1 is now coming off a double screen on the opposite side of the floor from #3 and #4.





If #1 does not elect to pass the ball, the court will be spread so he can attack the rim on the dribble drive.







#3 down screens for #4 to begin the play.


#4 pops out and receives the inbounds pass from #1.

#5 now sets a down screen for #2 trying to get him open for the next pass from #4.







#3 cuts to the right low block area at the same time.






### Usa set play 5

#1 drives the ball from left to right while #2 cuts off of screens from #4 and #5.

#3 cuts up on the high left wing area.




### USA Set Play vs. Man Defense

#1 now reverses this dribble back towards #4 who flashes to the high post and then cuts back door looking for the lob to the rim.



#1 enters the ball to #4 stepping out. #1 follows his pass and cuts to the ball side wing area.







#1 flares to the left wing looking for the pass from #2.






#1 drives at #2 on the right wing and executes a dribble hand-off.

They quickly change direction with #4 cutting over the back of #5 to the high post while #5 cuts to the basket.

#3 can either pass directly to #5 or use #4 in the high post for the high / low entry.








#### New Zealand Set Play vs. Man Defense

#1 passes to #4 and then cuts to the left wing area.

#2 cuts to the right low block area while #3 curls up and around the screen from #5.

#4 looks to pass to #3 coming off the screen and curl cut.



If #3 did not get the ball, #4 will look to pass for #2 for the open jumper.




#1 follows his pass and runs a cut towards #2.


### New Zealand Transition Pick and Roll Entry


#5 passes to #2 for the open jumper.

If #2 does not have a shot, he will look for #4 on the ball side low block, cutting off a screen from #3.

#5 may also keep the ball and look to hit #3 stepping to the ball after #4 cuts over the screen.


